



Become an Assistant Professor in Landscape Architecture

- Supervise undergraduate and graduate students;

- Participate actively in the academic life, functioning and development of the School, Faculty and institution through contributions to committees and working groups;
- Contribute to the influence of the discipline and of the Université de Montréal through conferences, publications and other major scientific and professional activities.

What you'll need to succeed

- Hold a Ph.D degree in landscape architecture, planning or a related discipline. Candidates who have submitted their thesis will also be considered;
- Hold a bachelor's or master's degree in landscape architecture;
- Be a member of, or eligible for membership in, one of the provincial associations of landscape architects in Canada;
- Demonstrate an ability to produce high-level research;
- Have an excellent record of accomplishments and publications;
- Demonstrate the ability to provide high-quality teaching and supervision at undergraduate, graduate and doctoral levels;
- Have conceptual design abilities and design skills;
- Demonstrate the potential to develop internal, national and international collaborations;
- The ability to work as part of a team in an interdisciplinary context and to complement the teaching staff;
- Adequate proficiency in the French language or a strong commitment to mastering the proficiency level required upon assuming the position in accordance to [Université de Montréal's Language Policy](#). A French language learning assistance program is offered to all professors who wish to acquire French language skills or enhance their communication abilities.
