Clinician Position In Ophthalmology

The Faculté de médecine vétérinaire (FMV) of the Université de Montréal is currently seeking qualified candidates for a clinician position in ophthalmology. The FMV is located in Saint-Hyacinthe, the agricultural capital of Quebec. The FMV is located 60 km (37 miles) from Montreal, a vibrant city with an international airport and excellent flight connections to Europe, the USA. The chosen person will work within the Centre hospitalier universitaire vétérinaire (CHUV) in collaboration with several specialists - anesthesiology, dentistry, dermatology, medical imaging, internal medicine, neurology, emergency medicine and intensive care - committed to providing the best veterinary care. This person will also work in collaboration with all hospitals and in this context, will be required to treat diverse species (cats, dogs, horses, birds, exotic animals, zoo animals, small and large ruminants). As a clinician, you will have the opportunity to contribute to the excellence of the Faculté de médecine vétérinaire:

Through your teaching (for a maximum of 90% of the appointment), you will also ensure the visibility of your discipline and your research activities in addition to actively participate in the operation of a renowned institution (for a minimum of 10% of the appointment). As such, you will:

- > Participate in clinical teaching through provision of care and services meeting the different needs of the ophthalmology service clientele;
- > Participate in clinical teaching of interns and residents in ophthalmology;
- > Supervise veterinary students and rotating interns and residents;
- > Evaluate student learning;
- > Provide educational advice and assistance to students.

To succeed in this role, you must have the following qualifications:

- > Doctor in veterinary medecine or equivalent degree;
- > Completion of a formal residency training program in ophthalmology;
- Certification by the American College of Veterinary Ophthalmology (ACVO) or ECVO (European College of Veterinary Ophthalmology) board certification eligibility for certification of either college and obtention of the certification within two (2) years following the start date;
- Work experience (possibly including work experience during residency) and interest in clinical teaching of ophthalmology in an academic environment;
- > Obtain a licence to practice veterinary medicine issues by the Ordre des médecins vétérinaires du Québec;

An adequate knowledge of the French written and spoken language or a strong commitment to mastering the proficiency level required, in accordance to <u>Université de Montréal's Language Policy</u>. An institutional learning support program is offered to all professors wishing to learn French or improve their communication skills.
